The author focuses on Heb 9:22–23 as the basis for his arguments noting that the use of *analogia entis* by *Auctor* is principal in the construction of a biblical Christology. While She does not see the descriptive interpretation as the final approach to the text, he does acknowledge its importance and builds on it to construct his argument. This study is certain to generate widespread discourse, particularly in evangelical scholarship, and will not only further expand the biblical horizon, but will do so in a direction that invites further conversation.
