PREFACE

I never really understood why being a Christian was so hard. I knew God was real and I believed everything he said, but nothing in my life reflected any of his promises in the Bible. I was confused; I was disheartened; I thought I was the only one—I thought I was going crazy. Surely there couldn't be anything wrong with God, so there had to be something wrong with me. I read so much, tried so much, learned so much about Christ, but nothing seemed to really shift or change. Then I finally found the answer. God's truths were wrapped up and hidden within different fragments of my identity and soul. Unfamiliar pieces and divine realities were simply misaligned, tangled up, and out of sync. There was nothing wrong with me. I stepped into Christ's full DNA the moment I answered his call—we all did. We all just simply forgot to go back to school to find out who we'd really become in Christ. Unravelling the habits and traits of our old DNA and stepping into the new gives a voice to the unspoken, common narrative of our Christian experiences. It pours out our internal dialogues and watches Christ step in to reorganize and realign what we thought were hopeless messes and expired dreams. Our God is so, so faithful—what he's put inside you will blow your mind!

Knowing Who's In Control

This is about accepting the absolute truth of who God is, and of knowing he is in total control of everything and everyone.

God doesn't just have power over Christians, but over every human that has lived; over every government; over the weather; over the oceans and waves, and over all the forces of darkness and evil.

God has no rival or equal, and the devil is not his archenemy. They are not matched, so there is absolutely no competition. God is the uncreated one; he created everything, including the devil.

God gave all humans free will and, in the beginning, dominion and power over all the earth, including all things spiritual and physical. In the garden, Adam and Eve gave their power to Satan. And that is the power that Satan operates with—he has none of his own. When we accept the calling of Jesus, that power is reinstated back to us, through God's sovereign will.

The devil works by deceiving and manipulating us into believing he still has power over us—that is a lie. And this is what the Bible is here for, to put us in constant remembrance of our position in Christ, our dominion in Christ, and our inheritance in Christ.

God has complete and utter and total control. The last two verses of Isaiah 54 tell us that even the weapons that the devil tries to use against us were originally created by God. That is why we can take comfort in the scriptures that tell us no weapons formed against us can prosper.

Knowing Who's In Control

There has only ever been one creator: our Father, God. At his best, the devil can mimic things that have already been created. But he is powerless to make anything new, because there is only one God.

This opening chapter is really about understanding this critical foundation—that God is God all by himself. He reigns in all majesty and power, and he is elevated far above all the works of his hands, above all people and nations, above every angel and demon. Lord of all and Lord over all.

Let's prepare our hearts and minds to receive and acknowledge this truth. It's the knowledge of his sovereign power that allows us to revere him, honor him, and be led by him.
